


Equity Work Group

Root District Desired Outcomes

- Community Ownership
 - Residential and Commercial Land Trust
- Equity in the built environment
 - Affordable Housing
 - Development equity scorecard
- Job Training/Career Development
 - What partners can be assembled to establish career pathways for minority populations?
 - Wealth building and job creation





Root District Desired Outcomes

- Engagement with vulnerable populations, homeless and transitional housing advocates and stakeholders
- Exploration of new public assets (parks and publicly accessible spaces)
- Advancement of current public assets, explicitly the Farmer's Market, and adjacent publicly owned land.

Equity vs. Inequity

Equity

justice according to natural law or right specifically: freedom from bias or favoritism.

Inequity

an instance of injustice or unfairness.
Inequalities occur when biased or unfair policies,
programs, practices, or situations contribute to a
lack of equality in educational performance,
results, and outcomes.
