### FlexPass Commuting Study

FlexPass is an innovative monthly parking option for the ABC Ramps that seeks to better meet the needs of a modern commuter. With FlexPass, you may save money on your commute by paying for fewer days of guaranteed parking, using transit, or telecommuting. The University of Minnesota seeks participants to join a research study to help evaluate FlexPass for commuters this fall, September–December 2021.

### Who can participate?

Anyone interested in purchasing a parking contract at ABC Ramps, 18 years or older, can participate in the study, including existing ABC Ramps contract holders. People who currently own a parking contract at a city-owned and -operated ramp are not eligible to participate in the study.

### FlexPass Contract Options

#### FlexPark: Parking Only

- Pay a reduced price for fewer days of parking.
- 14 days per month of guaranteed parking
- \$95 per month

#### FlexPlus: Parking & Transit

- Pay a reduced price for combined transportation options
- 14 days per month of guaranteed parking
- Unlimited transit from Metro Transit
- \$125 per month

#### Both options include In-and-out privileges on days you park.

# Latin Caribbean tapas restaurant coming to Minneapolis' North Loop

Chef Pedro Wolcott has lived and traveled all over North and South America, and he plans to apply the wide-ranging culinary skills that he's picked up along the way at his new Latin Caribbean tapas restaurant in Minneapolis' North Loop neighborhood.

Wolcott and partner <u>Giancarlo</u>
<u>Quintero</u> just signed a lease at 337 N.
Washington Ave. in the Dock Street
Flats building, where they plan to
open Guacaya Bistreaux next March.

Guacaya Bistreaux will focus on Latin Caribbean cuisine with a New Orleans twist. Its menu will showcase about 10 tapas, such as ceviches, arepas and boudin balls, plus about five entrees that are still meant to be shared, including whole fried fish, jerk chicken and grilled steak. The good news just keeps coming for the North Loop's restaurant scene. We're about to get a brand new Latin Caribbean tapas restaurant and bar with the opening of Guacaya Bistreaux at 337 North Washington Avenue in March.

It will be co-owned by North Loop resident Pedro Wolcott who promises to add some New Orleans creole and cajun influences to his tapas and shareable entrees.

The 2,800 square foot space, previously occupied by Dunn Brothers Coffee and Lolê Clothing before the pandemic hit, will have seating for about 90 people inside and as many as 60 outside.

Wolcott told Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal that the new restaurant will help introduce new cuisines to the neighborhood. "We think Guacaya Bistreaux is perfect for the North Loop. There's no tapas, there's not a Latin Caribbean restaurant here," he said. "We feel that that's a good fit for the neighborhood, to bring something different, something colorful, something vibrant, and we feel like this is the perfect place for that."



New Tex-Mex Restaurant Here Will Be Trans Woman-Owned

When her restaurant, **MB Foodhouse** opens inside the North Loop Galley in early November, Kristen Martinez hopes to introduce Minnesotans to Tex-Mex food unlike any they've ever tried.

She, after all, is unlike any restaurateur you've ever encountered: a Trans Woman of Color, forced by a pandemic to take a break from touring with her noise rap band and open a restaurant that's developed a cult following in south Minneapolis.

MB Foodhouse will have a menu of tacos, carnitas and taquitos—the type her Mexican-born grandmother and mother made in her hometown of El Paso, Texas—as well as rib tips and chicken wings.

"I'm Mexican and Black," Martinez said, "so you'll see a little bit of that Black southern kind of culture coming in with the barbecue."

For Martinez, representation is an important part of the business. "We wanted to focus on having a space that was not in the buzzword type of 'inclusion' but in the literal type of inclusion where I'm the face of the business and it's more comfortable for people that are maybe LGBTQ or POC to come into an establishment where they can see people that look like them."

Martinez's band, Moodie Black, had its tour schedule wiped out by the pandemic in 2020.

To make money, she started a pop-up restaurant based out of her home, then moved this year into an unused section of a coffee shop at 34th and Lyndale Avenue South. But without a full kitchen there, she had to cook the food in a commissary in Northeast Minneapolis and drive it to the coffee shop each day.

During a recent trip to the North Loop Galley (she's a Wrecktangle Pizza devotee), she asked about the open space and was able to strike a deal with the owner.

"We just make food that we love and that we have in the Southwest that you don't see at Mexican spots in the Cities often. There are a lot of great Mexican places here but they're not Tex-Mex style. Tex-Mex is very different."

On weekends, MB Foodhouse will offer breakfast bowls and breakfast tortillas. It's tentatively set to open on November 8th.

#### Butcher & The Boar's New Location In The North Loop

The new owners of Butcher & The Boar restaurant just announced that they've found a new home: in the North Loop's Bassett Creek Business Center on 3rd Street North.

Butcher & The Boar, which used to be at 12th and Hennepin downtown, is now owned by Jester Concepts which already operates Borough and Parlour in the North Loop.

In a Star Tribune article, Jester Concepts owner Brent Frederick is quoted as saying, "We really wanted to find the neighborhood that was the right fit. Right now, the downtown core is ailing a little bit, not everyone is back to work, it's a little empty, so we wanted to find the right pocket."

The Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal said the new restaurant space will be designed by the well-known firm, Shea. "We'll be keeping the soul of the original brand — fine-casual with fire at its heart," Shea Design Director Cori Kuechenmeister said in a statement. "We'll help create an energetic bar, dining room and dynamic patio scene, offering guests different experiences under one roof."


# THE NEXT 90 DAYS – DELTA VARIANT LOCAL IMPACT

- Leisure travel continues to grow with events returning






# **WEEKLY HOTEL PERFORMANCE**

## **SUMMARY**

- We are continuing to see incremental gains in our hotel performance driven by leisure travelers
- Despite increases, our occupancy and RevPAR are at less than 50% of our pre-pandemic levels and not expected to start reaching recovery levels until the end of Q1 next year and will not fully recover to 2019 levels in 2022
- If our 2022 groups hold, that will help push our recovery as a destination, but future years are a concern for long term recovery outlook
- The Delta variant and lack of workforce will remain two of the largest threats to our recovery efforts






# 59.7% SAYING THAT THE COVID VARIANT IS MAKING THEM LESS INTERESTED IN TRAVEL

(Base: Wave 72 data. All respondents, 1,212 completed surveys. Data collected August 18-20, 2021)








# 47% SAYING THAT THEY STILL INTEND TO TRAVEL THIS YEAR – 36% HAVE POSTPONED

Has the spread of the new Delta variant of COVID-19 over the last few weeks impacted your travel intentions for the rest of the year?






# **EXCITEMENT FOR LEISURE TRAVEL RIGHT NOW, HOWEVER, ACTUALLY ROSE TO 67.0%**


# ATTENDING A CONFERENCE OR CONVENTION CONTINUES TO FEEL UNSAFE (32.1%)





# 58% STATING THEY ARE UNLIKELY TO ATTEND A CONVENTION UNTIL COVID IS RESOLVED (RISING)
